

How to Include Wellshire in Your Will

It's Easier than You May Think

1. Think about the type of gift — the “bequest” — you wish to leave to Wellshire or the Wellshire Endowment Fund.
2. Consult with an attorney or financial planner, if appropriate, to discuss how to provide effectively for both your family and your church.
3. Contact an attorney to create or amend your will. You can also use various will making computer software programs.

Tip: Many choose to update their wills following a life change: marriage, divorce, birth, retirement, death of a loved one, or planning for a trip. This may be an ideal time to add Wellshire to your will as well.

4. Be content in knowing you are serving God's purpose: to be faithful to all generations.
5. If you wish, please let Chuck Sparks, our Church Administrator, know of your bequest so that we can celebrate your gift.

Share Your Faith and Blessings in the Manner You Choose

When you give to Wellshire through your will, you are making a gift that keeps on giving to future generations of members and church ministries. We recommend that you give to the Endowment Fund in general, so that church leadership will have flexibility in directing financial resources where needed. But you may also pick a specific focus area to which your gift will be directed.

A "bequest" is the term that is used to leave a gift to Wellshire through your will. There are many types of bequests you can make. For example:

- You may give a **specific asset**, such as the shares of a common stock that you own.

- You may give a **dollar amount**, either a fixed dollar amount (such as \$30,000) or a percentage (such as 15 percent of a residuary estate).
- You may give a **contingency bequest**. If your primary beneficiary predeceases you, you may leave a designated sum to Wellshire.

An attorney can assist you with all your bequest options, as well as the appropriate wording. Bequests to the endowment should be made to the "Wellshire Endowment Fund of Wellshire Presbyterian Church."
