If your child should ever need medication or an EpiPen at school because an allergic reaction, please complete **Allergy/Anaphylaxis Health Care Plan**. The PDO Director will email you the form. This form must be kept on file at PDO. Medication cannot be given without these completed forms. This form must be filled out, and signed by your child's pediatrician, then signed by a parent. This is the care plan that PDO follows, if your child is exposed to an allergen while at school. If the allergen is dietary, please fill that form, too.

The following are required for attendance at PDO:

- Medicine and/or an EpiPen must be provided by a parent or guardian.
- Medication and/or an EpiPen must be in its original packaging.
- Prescription medication and EpiPen must have the pharmacy prescription label attached. The Allergy/Anaphylaxis Health Care Plan must be completed and signed by the child's physician, and parent.

Medication may be brought to school each day, or it can be left at PDO. While the medication is at PDO, it is stored in the classroom. It is stored out of reach of the children, but accessible to the staff if needed. Medication cannot be kept in a child's backpack or cubbie.

Safety is a high priority for us and we make every attempt to avoid exposing your child to an allergen, but we cannot guarantee that your child will not be exposed.
